Aaron W. Perlman, MD

Dr. Aaron Perlman was a pioneer physician, passionate about improving the care and quality of life for people with cerebral palsy. During his long career he cared for many, if not most, of Cincinnati's children with cerebral palsy. Dr. Perlman was the founder of Pediatric Orthopaedics and the CP Clinic at Cincinnati Children's. In 1994, UCP's Cerebral Palsy Services Center at Cincinnati Children's was renamed in his honor. He remained actively involved in the Aaron W. Perlman Center, now a department of Cincinnati Children's, volunteering, fundraising and advocating for children with cerebral palsy until his death at age 96. This conference is inspired by his life...and his passion for living, learning and caring for others.

The Perlman Center

The Aaron W. Perlman Center is a specialty center of Cincinnati Children's and part of the new CP Program. The Perlman Center provides multidisciplinary and integrated therapy programs and care coordination for children, youth and adults with cerebral palsy and their families. It is a regional center for assistive technology services and for the applications of advanced technologies to support communication, mobility, seating and positioning, computer access and physical development.
