

It has been a busy year for AACPDM leadership as we continue to drive forward with our new strategic plan. You will recall from prior communications and newsletters, that the process to update the Strategic Plan started in November, 2021. The vote on the 2022 Bylaws Proposed Changes represent an update in language to the AACPDM Vision and Mission statements. In overview regarding how the updated language was developed:

- November
  - The consultant company, Vista Cova was picked to help guide the process.
- December/January
  - We held two Town Hall meetings, each lasting 1 hour and with over 100 participants combined.
- January/February
  - We conducted a survey of current and past members and Vista Cova conducted deep dive interviews with about two dozen members of AACPDM.
- February/March
  - The AACPDM Board of Directors and committee chairs were oriented to the interview and survey responses by Vista Cova as a pre-retreat preparation.
  - The AACPDM Board of Directors and committee chairs engaged in a lively and stimulating 1 ½ day in-person strategic planning retreat in Chicago.
- April/May
  - The AACPDM Executive Committee created final options for the Vision and Mission Statements which was circulated to Board of Directors and committee chairs for voting
  - $\circ$   $\;$  These responses were reviewed by the Board of Directors for discussion and review.
  - The AACPDM Board of Directors approved the proposed final draft Vision and Mission statements.
- June
  - The proposed statements will be circulated to the AACPDM membership for voting and final approval with the ballot for elected positions.
